ST. LOUIS TO HOST SUPERDRAFT



As the newest team in MLS, Seattle Sounders FC holds the No. 1 pick in the MLS SuperDraft, to be held Jan. 15 in St. Louis. General manager Adrian Hanauer, head coach Sigi Schmid and technical director Chris Henderson will be at the St. Louis Convention Center along with officials from the other MLS clubs. Hanauer, Schmid, and Henderson will be joined by assistant coaches Brian Schmetzer and Tom Dutra at the adidas MLS Player Combine, Jan. 9-13 in Fort Lauderdale.



The SuperDraft consists of four rounds. In order to be eligible to draft, players must be: invited to participate in that year's MLS Player Combine; Generation adidas-signed players; or college players who no longer have college eligibility and are nominated by MLS teams. Sounders FC, as the league's newest franchise, own the first choice. The subsequent six selections are from teams that did not qualify for the 2008 playoffs or received in a trade from a team that did not qualify, beginning with the team with the fewest regular season points. The remaining eight positions are ranked by fewest regular season points among the teams that were eliminated in the same round of the MLS Cup Playoffs.

A player drafted by a particular team through the SuperDraft and who does not sign with the League, is placed on that team's "College Protected List" until the second Dec. 31 immediately following the draft in question, after which the team loses the rights to the player.

SUPERDRAFT PROSPECTS

Among those players receiving consideration for the No. 1 pick in the 2009 MLS SuperDraft are: Steve Zakuani, F, Akron; Omar Gonzalez, D, Maryland; O'Brian White, F, UConn; and Marcus Tracy, F, Wake Forest.

Zakuani this past season as a sophomore at Akron led the nation in goals (20) and points (47) while appearing in all 23 game for the Zips. He is one of three Hermann Trophy finalists and just the second sophomore overall to be named *Soccer America* Player of the Year. He is a Generation adidas player.

Gonzalez, an All-ACC center back, led his Maryland team to victory, 1-0, over North Carolina in the NCAA College Cup final. He was chosen the tournament's Most Outstanding Defensive Player.

White, a senior striker, was hampered by injury in 2008, scoring six goals in 14 games played. In 2007, White led the nation in goals (23) and points (53) and earned the coveted Hermann Trophy.

Tracy, a 2008 All-ACC forward and Hermann Trophy finalist, started all 34 games played and scored 13 goals and 10 assists, while leading Wake Forest to their second consecutive College Cup. In 2007, Tracy scored one goal and one assist in the College Cup final win over Ohio State, 2-1.

FIRST KICK MARCH 19TH

The inaugural Seattle Sounders FC game will be featured as Major League Soccer's opening date for the 2009 season. MLS First Kick pits Sounders FC hosting the New York Red Bulls on Thursday night, March 19, in a match nationally televised by ESPN2 and ESPN Deportes.

Kickoff is scheduled for 6 p.m. Pacific Time at Qwest Field. Sounders FC will be making its debut as the 15th team in MLS. New York is the 2008 MLS Cup runner-up.

"By being selected for the first match of the 2009 MLS season, this presents an opportunity to show a national audience what all the excitement is about in Seattle," said Sounders FC majority owner Joe Roth. "Our supporters will be in full voice and, along with our players, wearing green. It promises to be quite a spectacle."

The balance of the First Kick (MLS Opening Weekend) schedule features five matches on March 21 and another on March 22.

It was also announced that Seattle will be the guest for the Toronto FC home opener April 4. That match is scheduled for a 12 noon Pacific kickoff.

The complete MLS schedule will be released in early February. Each team will play a 30-game regular season. Each team will play every other MLS team home and away,

for a base of 28 games. Two additional games against intra-conference rivals will complete each team's league schedule. The regular season ends on Oct. 25.

Since the Seattle franchise was awarded in November of 2007, 18,460 season tickets have been purchased. Qwest Field capacity for Sounders FC games is 24,500.

SOUNDERS SUPERSEARCH ON KING 5



The Seattle Sounders FC, Disney Corporation and Belo announced the program schedule for the inaugural Sounders SuperSearch presented by Disney.

The tryouts from three Washington cities will air on *Evening Magazine* and *Northwest Sports Tonight* on three consecutive Thursdays; January 8 (Spokane session), January 15 (Seattle) and January 22 (Yakima). The shows will be broadcast across all of Belo's local properties including: KING 5 (NBC), KONG 6/16 and NWCN.

Beginning on January 23, fans can visit www.king5.com to view videos, bios and comments from evaluators for all 10 finalists. Fans may vote for their favorite player from January 26-30. The finalist with the most fan votes will be guaranteed a spot in the final four.

The final tryout show will be broadcast live on Sunday, February 1, 2009, following Super Bowl XLIII on KING 5 (approximately 8:30 p.m.). The winner will be selected by a distinguished panel of judges and awarded a spot on the 2009 Sounders FC roster.

Over 1,000 players registered to participate in the Sounders SuperSearch during a series of three regional tryout events designed to help the team find a talented player ready to compete in the MLS. The tryouts were held in Spokane, Tukwila and Yakima.

All Sounders FC matches will be broadcast live on KING 5 or KONG 6/16, except those broadcast nationally. Kevin Calabro will call the action. Each broadcast will feature an exclusive pregame show and a postgame wrap-up. Belo will also produce a weekly show.

SOUNDERS FC COACHING STAFF

SIGI SCHMID

Head Coach

Named the goalkeeper coach on Dec. 29, 2008 after serving two seasons as keeper coach for the USL Sounders. Dutra has worked with Kasey Kelle in offseason training sessions since 2002. Under Dutra's guidance the past two years, Chris Eylander twice led USL-1 in saves and finished second in shutouts.

Named the first head coach of Seattle Sounders FC on Dec. 16, 2008, and is recognized as one of the most successful coaches in MLS history. Since 1999, Schmid's teams have won six major titles, including two MLS Cups.

Schmid is the most successful active coach in MLS history and a two-time coach of the year. This past 2008 season he guided the Columbus Crew to both their first MLS Cup and Supporters' Shield (best regular season point total), earning MLS Coach of the Year.

From 1999 through 2004 Schmid's L.A. Galaxy teams won four major competitions: 2002 MLS Cup, 2002 MLS Supporters' Shield, 2001 U.S. Open Cup and the 2001 CONCACAF Champions Cup.

He was voted the MLS Coach of the Year in his

first season, 1999. Altogether, his Galaxy teams were 79-53-32 and reached the MLS Cup final four times and won three division crowns.

Schmid ranks No. 2 in MLS career victories (113), behind only Bob Bradley (124), current U.S. National Team coach. In nine seasons, Schmid's teams have won 113 games, lost 86 and tied 57. His combined postseason win total (19) from L.A. and Columbus is the highest in MLS history.

Twice Schmid has served as U.S. Under-20 National Team head coach, most recently in 2005 at the FIFA World Championships.

Schmid first forged a winning tradition at his alma mater, UCLA. During a 19-year run (1980-98) the Bruins won three NCAA championships, qualified for the postseason 17 times and accumulated a record of 322-63-33.

BRIAN SCHMETZER

Assistant Coach

Named the top assistant coach on Dec. 22, 2008. A Seattle native, he is one of the Puget Sound soccer community's most recognizable figures after playing and coaching for the region's top professional franchises since 1980.

Schmetzer was head coach of the USL-1 Sounders from 2002-07. He guided Seattle to USL-1 championships in 2005 and 2007, and U.S. Open Cup semifinal advancements in 2007 and 2008.

Schmetzer has nine years of experience coaching and 15 years of playing at the professional level. He was a member of six championship teams during that span.

In addition to the two USL-1 championships, his teams also twice won the Commissioner's Cup for the best record and qualified for the playoffs six times. He was chosen USL-1 Coach of the Year in 2002 after going 23-4-1. The Sounders were league runners-up in 2004. His overall regular season record was 100-57-41.

TOM DUTRA

Named the goalkeeper coach on Dec. 29, 2008 after serving two seasons as keeper coach for the USL Sounders. Dutra has worked with Kasey Kelle in offseason training sessions since 2002.
