Game Notes

After a weekend split on the road, Seattle opens the second half of their season with a three-game homestand boasting their second best record (6-3, 52 points). The San Diego Nomads come to Seattle with an eight game winning streak in which they handed Seattle a 1-0 loss over the weekend. San Diego, Southern Division leaders with a record of (8-1), attribute much of their success to **Steve Boardman** and **Jerome Watson** as the pacers of their attack; they are the third and fifth leading scorers in the WSL respectively. The series between Seattle and San Diego stands at 3-3-1, but the storm are ready to change the balance in their favor. A win tonight could boost the Storm into first place, for they are within 7 points of Northern Division co-leaders Portland (7-3) and San Francisco Bay (6-3).

Overcoming a rash of injuries and a continuously changing lineup, the Storm nonetheless were able to post a 2-1 victory over the Heat in L.A. The weekend's lineup against L.A. featured an interesting component. It had all the makings of a former Huskies match, as it featured six current or former soccerdogs in the lineup. Forward, **John Klein**, a 1986 graduate, stepped into the lineup in place of **Brent Goulet**, putting away his first goal of the season to put Seattle up 1-0. **Peter Fewing** in his fourth season with the Storm wrapped up the win for the Storm in the 65th minute as he nailed one into the back of the net. The Huskies factor seemed to provide the Storm with the necessary edge Seattle needed to thwart the Heat in L.A. With numerous injuries and national team commitments affecting the team, **Coach Tommy Jenkins** has been forced to field a different starting lineup in each of their last games, with only goalie **Jeff Koch**, and defenders **Joe James** and **Grant Gibbs** as the mainstays.

Chris Henderson, a recent graduate of Everett's Cascade High School, is the youngest Storm member. Chris got the chance to see action in the last week's game against South Korea as he put away the tying goal for the U.S. National B team. Unfortunately, Chris will be in South Korea competing with the National Team and is not expected to

return until the June 30 game against Real Santa Barbara.

The Storm are proud to welcome aboard goalkeeper **Matt Olson**, a graduate of Lindberg High School and a starter for the Indiana Hoosiers 1988 NCAA championship squad. Matt will be backing up Jeff Koch in goal for the Storm.

To date, **Brent Goulet** remains out after tearing ligaments in his left ankle during the Storm's game against Sacramento. Goulet, the National team scoring leader, also missed last Saturday's World Cup qualifying game against Guatemala. The U.S. team gave an outstanding performance although it showed that they were without their scoring leader for it wasn't until the final minutes of the game before they were able to put one into the back of the net. To add to the already compounded list of injuries, **Peter Hattrup**, a protege of Seattle Pacific's National Championship team, remains doubtful for tonight's game with a stress fracture to his foot. **Ricky Davis** may be fit for duty, although if he is, there is a good chance that he will be recalled by the National team for their exhibition game against Columbia in Miami. **Clint Carnell**, a new edition to the Storm roster from Bothell is questionable with a toe injury, as is ex-Huskies **Rick Blubaugh**, with an ankle injury.
