Game Notes

Pre-game action tonight is provided by two high caliber women's teams. FC Seattle Coach Clive Charles has organized a Pacific Northwest All-Star team to challenge one of the best women's teams in our nation, the California Tremors. The Tremors were 1989 National Women's Champions. Five of the Tremors players are currently U.S. National Team players. These players were called to national team duty last month and were unable to join their teammates in defending their national amateur title. The Tremor's bid for a second straight national title was unsuccessful but the team is once again at full strength for tonight's match.

The goal-starved Seattle Storm, still owners of the second-best record in the Western Soccer League, hope to not only beat the L.A. Heat but pick-up some much-needed bonus points in the process tonight. This game could be a preview of a playoff matchup later this month. Seattle (8-3), the defending WSL champion, is bidding for its third straight postseason appearance while L.A. (9-4) leads the Southern Division. The top two teams in each division qualify for the playoffs. The storm is currently third in the North, but has played one less game than the leaders.

The Heat, already the WSL's top offensive team with 33 goals, bolstered their roster by adding U.S. National Team stars **Hugo Perez** and **Paul Caligiuri** last week. Both are former all-league performers, and Caligiuri, who spent the past three seasons playing in West Germany, was WSL Player of the Year in 1986. While L.A. may be without both newcomers plus goalie **David Vanole** and forward **Jim Gabarra** this week due to Team USA duty, they will have **Jeff Hooker**, one of the league's top scorers.

Having scored just five goals in their past five games, the Storm is losing ground in the playoff race, despite winning four of those contests. The WSL awards six points for a victory and one bonus point for each goal up to a maximum of three each game. This season Seattle has managed only three maximum 9-point wins. Last year they earned six such totals in 12 league outings.

Seattle is looking for the first season sweep in this four-year-old series. The

Storm won 2-1 in L.A. June 18, the first road win by either club, and took a 4-3 lead overall. Last year the Storm rolled to 5-0 triumph at home with **Grant Gibbs** and **Peter Hattrup** each scoring twice.

With the offense struggling and the roster freeze date (July 10) only a week away, Coach **Tommy Jenkins** has hinted that some personnel moves are pending. Two spots remain open on the 24-man roster, and three of Jenkin's top attacking players are currently on the sidelines. Seattle will once again be without **Brent Goulet** (torn ligaments in left ankle) and **Ricky Davis** (knee rehab). Goulet is expected to miss another two weeks. Davis's status is uncertain. **Peter Hattrup**, plagued by a stress fracture in his right foot, practiced last week but remains questionable.

Coach Jenkins has added a new player to the Storm roster. **Gary Heale**, forward, most recently with the LA Lazers and formerly a player for the Tacoma Stars, has just joined the squad.

Eddie Henderson's first-half goal proved to be the difference in the Storm's 1-0 defeat of Real Santa Barbara last week. Henderson tallied his fourth score of the season and his second-game winner turfskidded inside the right post. Goalkeeper **Jeff Koch** made two saves to earn his third shutout and give Seattle its third straight win. Left fullback **Daryl Green**, providing stout defense as well as threatening overlaps down the flank, was named media player of the game.
